

The emergency health care needs of >40,000 patients with complex multimorbidity

Longitudinal data for >40,000 patients presenting acutely with multimorbidity including demographics, comorbidities, serial physiology, frailty scores, blood results, medications, drug allergies, treatments, procedures and 12-month mortality.


Demographic

The dataset includes:

- Young adults **7%** (ages 15-24)
- Adults **48%** (ages 25-64)
- Elderly **45%** (ages 65+)

The majority of the patients are of White ethnic background accounting for **66%** of the population followed by 14% Asian, 11% Unknown, 4% black/African/Caribbean, 3% Other and 2% Mixed.

- **5K** Chronic ischaemic heart disease



Frailty index

The average hospital electronic record frailty index (HERFI) is 0.36, moderately frail. The average Frailty Index score by QEHB (FI-QEHB) is 0.31, moderately frail.



Laboratory tests

4.5M serial laboratory tests recorded including complete blood counts, liver functions tests and more.

Other laboratory tests are available.

Inpatient care

- **61,636 Hospitalised spells;** containing **39,511** unique patients admitted to hospital
- **395K** days worth of hospital data with an average in-hospital length of stay of 6 days
- Hospital mortality rate of 3% with and a survival rate of 87% within 1 year of discharge

The average national early warning score (NEWS2) is 2, indicating low clinical risk

Comorbidity mortality

The average number of ICD10 coded comorbidities in patient spells is 7.
